

Tuition Fee Charging and Refunding Policy 2016/17

Further to DMU's enrolment processes (whether online or via paper form), under the terms and conditions of enrolment, all students agree to the following:

- Liability for all tuition fees incurred over the duration of their programme of study, in whole or in part, and that if the student or their sponsor fail to pay their tuition fees in a timely manner that DMU reserves the right to terminate the student's studies.
- Understanding that DMU reserves the right to take legal action against the student in order to recover any debt.
- Understanding that should a student wish to leave DMU before the end of their programme of study, the student is responsible for contacting the University to terminate (or interrupt) their enrolment and that the student is liable to incur costs equating to up to a full year of tuition fee if their registration is terminated by DMU on behalf of the student.

Taking out a Tuition Fee Loan

1. You will be formally liable for your total tuition fee from the start date of your course/first day of term. We recognise, however, that where you have taken out a tuition fee loan, payments will be made by the Student Loans Company on your behalf, shortly after the dates shown below.

2. After the 10th of October 2016, once a term has started, you are liable for the full fee for that term, even if you withdraw or interrupt your course during the term.

16. Where you withdraw or interrupt your studies during the first term, 25 per cent of the fee will be due for payment irrespective of the date of withdrawal/interruption. For withdrawals and interruptions occurring after the Christmas vacation, a pro-rata charge will be levied on a daily basis.

Postgraduate students

All new home and EU students

17. Your total tuition fee for 2016/17 will be charged from the start date of your course/first day of term. Instalment payment plans are available, please contact <u>income@dmu.ac.uk</u> for details.

18. Where you withdraw or interrupt your studies during the first term after the 10th of October 2016, 25 per cent of the fee will be due for payment irrespective of the date of withdrawal. For withdrawals and interruptions occurring after the Christmas vacation, a prorata charge will be levied on a daily basis.



19. **Please note**: If you have taken out a Postgraduate Loan from the Student Loans Company, please ensure you have read the terms and conditions of your student funding package loan agreement. The processing and awarding of your student package is totally independent of the university. Any student funding payments made to you are made in line with your loan agreement with the Student Loans Company.

20. If your course has a non-standard start date (i.e., a date other than the 3rd of October 2016), you have 14 days (10 working days) from the standard enrolment day for your cohort (this can be clarified by the faculty) during which you can officially withdraw from your course or interrupt your studies and a fee will not be levied.

All new overseas students

23. Your total tuition fee for 2016/17 will be charged from the start date of your course/first day of term. 50 per cent of the fees must be paid by 31 October 2016 and the balance can be paid by instalments. For details, please contact <u>income@dmu.ac.uk</u>.

24. Where you withdraw or interrupt your studies during the first term after the 10th of October 2016, 50 per cent of the fee will be due for payment irrespective of the date of withdrawal. For withdrawals and interruptions occurring after the Christmas vacation, a prorata charge will be levied on a daily basis.

25. If your course has a non-standard start date (i.e., a date other than the 3rd of October 2016), you have 14 days (10 working days) from the standard enrolment day for your cohort (this can be clarified by the faculty) during which you can officially withdraw from your course or interrupt your studies and a fee will not be levied.

All returning overseas students

26. Your total tuition fee for 2016/17 will be charged from the start date of your course/first day of term. 50 per cent of the fees must be paid by 31 October 2016 and the balance can be paid by instalments. For details, please contact income@dmu.ac.uk.



27. Where you withdraw or interrupt your studies during the first term, 50 per cent of the fee will be due for payment irrespective of the date of withdrawal. For withdrawals and interruptions occurring after the Christmas vacation, a pro-rata charge will be levied on a daily basis.

Distance Learning students (Undergraduate and Postgraduate)

All new home, EU and overseas students

28. Your total tuition fee for 2016/17 will be charged from the start date of your course/first day of term. Instalment payment plans are available; please contact <u>income@dmu.ac.uk</u> for details.

29. Where you withdraw or interrupt your studies during the first term after the 10th of October 2016, 25 per cent of the fee will be due for payment irrespective of the date of withdrawal. For withdrawals and interruptions occurring after the Christmas vacation, a prorata charge will be levied on a daily basis.

30. As distance learning programmes are not attendance based, it is vital that students notify DMU of their intention to interrupt or withdraw, as fees will be pro-rated to the date on which we are notified of your interruption/withdrawal.

31. If your course has a non-standard start date (i.e., a date other than the 3rd of October 2016), you have 14 days (10 working days) from the standard enrolment day for your cohort (this can be clarified by the faculty) during which you can officially withdraw from your course or interrupt your studies and a fee will not be levied.

All returning home, EU and overseas students

32. Your total tuition fee for 2016/17 will be charged from the start date of your course/first day of term. Instalment payment plans are available; please contact <u>income@dmu.ac.uk</u> for details.

33. Where you withdraw or interrupt your studies during the first term, 25 per cent of the fee will be due for payment irrespective of the date of withdrawal. For withdrawals and interruptions occurring after the Christmas vacation, a pro-rata charge will be levied on a daily basis.
