# Underlying Principles


- Freirian principles of dialogue

# What is our experience of education?

- 3 groups reflected on their experience of education: primary, secondary, tertiary, HE
- 2 Themes emerged:
  - A continuation of discrimination that had pervaded a whole educational career
  - Differences identified by students who had experienced educational institutions elsewhere

# Discriminatory themes at all levels

- Individual
- Scio –Cultural
- Structural



# How does it feel when we look at all experiences in one place

- Sense of lots of issues not clear where to start
- Sense of carrying a lot of baggage, sometimes a lifetimes' worth
- Upset at how systematic it is and how hard it has been to survive within it
- Ready to challenge
- More determined to succeed and to challenge for positive change
