19/5/2012	I would like to know where I can go or who I can talk to about appealing a grade I got on an assignment.	In the first instance you should speak to a tutor. If this doesn't help you and you want to take it further, then there is a formal process detailed on our website.

Can you tell me how 2nd and 3rd year marks are weighted and if the weakest modules are being dropped from our final marks. Also, if the dissertation always included?	We will take your marks from the best 210 credits across levels 5 and 6 of your course (years two and three of a full-time honours degree). It is possible that the dissertation (or some of the marks for it) would be excluded from the classification calculations, but you must pass it still. Good performance in the dissertation remains as essential as ever. For continuing students the classification will be calculated using both the old and new regulations, and whichever has the best outcome will be used.
